Welcome to Linn County

Linn County is located in the northern-central portion of Missouri. As of the 2020 Census, the population was 11,874. Its county seat is Linneus. The county was organized January 1, 1837, and named after U.S. Senator Lewis F. Linn of Missouri. Adjacent counties include Sullivan (north); Adair (northeast); Macon (east); Chariton (south); Livingston (west) and Grundy (northwest).

Originally a part of Chariton County, Linn County was established in 1837 as more people began to populate the area. Being a predominately agricultural area, farms and ranches grew at a rapid pace and Linn County became known as a source for quality animals and produce. Having rich soil which is suitable for various crops, Linn County quickly became known throughout Missouri as one of the best places for trade. The two main water resources, the Missouri and Mississippi Rivers, became the initial sources of transportation. Upon the construction of the numerous railroads which crisscrossed the state, much of the trade naturally drifted to rail.

Linn County is the home of one state park and two state historic sites, all three are located a few miles west of Brookfield. Pershing Boyhood Home State Historic Site is located in Laclede; Locust Creek Covered Bridge State Historic Site is located just east of Meadville; and Pershing State Park is located between Laclede and Meadville. All three facilities are just off US Highway 36. Linn County is also located on the first transcontinental highway, the Pikes Peak Ocean to Ocean Highway, locally known as State Route 8.

Throughout history, Linn County has produced numerous citizens who have contributed to the success of the American nation. Two of the most notable include General of the Armies of the United States, John J. "Blackjack" Pershing, commander of the U.S. Forces during World War 1 and Walt Disney, creator of one of the largest entertainment industries.

Linn County offers a variety of places to explore, shop and celebrate our rich heritage, and we hope you find this guide helpful.

Our Community

Located in the heart of North Missouri, Linn County encompasses several small towns and rural communities. The county seat is Linneus. Agriculture and manufacturing are among the county's central industries.

From its early settlements in the 1830s and its organization in 1837, Linn County has a rich history as an agricultural center and railroad gateway. Early settlers staked their claims to the land and built farms as early as 1831. Settlers were attracted to the swampy areas with tall prairie grasses as fowl hunters found this area to be great hunting. Several creeks and tributaries leading to the Grand River, as well as a few underground springs, provided water sources and fishing. Then came railroad construction, providing access to the rest of the country and commercial advancement as hard-working citizens in railroad towns built and opened post offices, shops, and other businesses.

The discovery of coal in this north Missouri area brought many miners to the area; Marcelline and Brookfield, two of the larger towns in Linn County, benefitted from the discovery of coal, and from the advancement of the railroad lines. The community of Bucklin helped write the first chapter in the history of the Missouri Farmers Association—best known as

MFA. This was also the beginning of the farmers' cooperative, which assisted in building many rural communities. Linn County's claim to fame comes from many historical figures and famous people who at one time called this area "home"—General John J. Pershing, cartoonist Walt Disney, Dr. Howard Rusk, American Physician awarded for Rehabilitation, Doris Akers, Composer of many gospel songs, and Hall of Fame basketball coach and NBA executive Gene Bartow, to name a few.

The people in Linn County's rural communities and towns are the true strength and heart-beat of the region. Churches, school districts, healthcare facilities, restaurants, post offices, and a variety of businesses and services serve their communities. Seasonal events, festivals, and high school sports tournaments bring in visitors from other areas of Missouri and the United States, and a few historical attractions bring in worldwide visitors as well.

Brookfield

Brookfield, situated at the intersection of U.S. Highways 36 and 11, is the largest city in Linn County with a population of 4,111 (2020 Census Bureau) and serves as a major center for commerce and industry, education, and healthcare in the county as well as the city. For over a century, manufacturing and agriculture have been major pacesetting factors in Brookfield's economic growth as well as the economic growth of adjacent communities.

The railroad played a significant role in Brookfield's history as the town was one of many Missouri cities along the trail of the Hannibal-St. Joseph Railroad, the first railroad to cross

Missouri and connect the second and third largest cities in Missouri prior to the American Civil War. The Hannibal-St. Joseph Railroad carried the first letter to the Pony Express from a train pulled behind the locomotive aptly named the Missouri. It was later acquired by the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad and became the property of Burlington Northern after the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad merged with three other railroads to form the new company.

At one point in its history, Brookfield was home to a Woolworth franchise store in 1923 and a JC Penney store in 1926. Fires destroyed the former JC Penney building and nearby businesses on Main Street on March 18, 1922, and the former Brookfield Carnegie Library was destroyed by fire on February 1, 1919. After the former location was condemned, the new library—now known as Brookfield Public Library—was opened in 1996 and consists of a meeting room, genealogy area, children’s area, public-use computers and areas for studying and reading. The discovery of coal in areas around Brookfield brought many miners to the area as well as to nearby mines in Marceline.

Brookfield’s coal mines remained a financial mainstay to the area until the late 1930s when the mines were closed.

After the Depression, Brookfield and other rural communities nationwide began losing population, but many small family farms consolidated into larger farms and Brookfield’s industrial development office went to work to bring new businesses and manufacturing to the area. People looking for a quiet and simpler life have moved out of urban areas into Brookfield and adjacent communities, and this trend has continued despite a winding economic path over the years.

In addition to a fire department, police department, and healthcare facilities, Brookfield has several parks, shopping areas, restaurants, playgrounds, and sports fields for everyone’s enjoyment. The Lavon Burris Community Center, with its modern kitchen and event room, provides hosting opportunities for family reunions, graduation parties, wedding receptions and other events. The Brookfield City Lake, as the town’s water reservoir, provides an area for fishing, boating, and picnicking; anglers enjoy the opportunities for catching channel catfish, crappie, and large-mouth bass.

Browning

Browning, a small community in Linn County located on the Linn-Sullivan County line along Missouri Route 5, is also located to Locust Creek on its west side. It was laid out and platted in 1872 and named in honor of the family of J.A. Browning, a railroad employee. Gene Bartow, a Hall of Fame college basketball coach and NBA executive, was born and raised in Browning.

It was once home to the school district that is now located in Purdin as Linn County R-1; the school building has been home to a bed-and-breakfast visitor center, preserving many of the classrooms and most of the structure. The population was 219 according to the 2020 Census Bureau. The Chicago, Burlington, and Quincy Railroad passes through the community.

Bucklin

Located in southeast Linn County, Bucklin was laid out in 1854 and named after James H. Bucklin, a railroad official of the Hannibal and St. Joseph Railroad. A post office has been in operation there since 1860. Bucklin's population was 413 at the time of the 2020 Census. Bucklin became known as the location of the first Missouri Farmers Association—now called Midwest Farmers Association, best known as MFA. Visitors to Bucklin can see the original building, still standing but abandoned. Delaney Funeral Home, a grocery store and a few other local businesses, including a farm supply business and a restaurant, are still in operation.

Laclede

Located in Linn County between Brookfield and Meadville, with the county seat Linneus to the north, Laclede was platted in 1853 and named for Pierre Laclede, the founder of St. Louis. The population was 305 at the 2020 Census—down from 345 in 2010. The Locust Creek Covered Bridge, the General John J. Pershing Boyhood Home, and Plum Grove School are all listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Nu-Rest Bedding Company and Green Hills Recycling Center are among the businesses located in Laclede.

John J. Pershing, an Army general and commander of the American Expeditionary Forces (AEF) in World War I, was born near Laclede in 1860. The Pershing Memorial Hospital in Brookfield was also named after him, and the annual Pershing Balloon Derby dedicated to his memory is held every year just outside of Brookfield every Labor Day Weekend.

Linneus

Linneus, the county seat of Linn County and formerly named Linnville, was named to honor Carl Linnaeus in 1840, a Swedish scientist and physician who formalized the modern system of naming organisms and thus became known as the “father of modern taxonomy”. A post office has been in operation since 1840. The Linn County Courthouse and the Linn County Jail and Sheriff's Residence are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



Marceline

Marceline is located in Linn and Chariton counties. The population was 2,123 at the time of the 2020 Census. Marceline was laid out and established in 1888 and was named after the wife of a railroad administrator. A post office in Marceline has been in operation since 1888. Marceline is famous for being the boyhood home of Walt Disney and the original Main Street USA that inspired the replication of that street in Disneyland as he remembered it from his time in Marceline. The Walt Disney Hometown Museum is located in the former Santa Fe Railroad depot, and two railroad engines and a caboose are on display in Ripley Square

The great expansion of the Santa Fe Railroad through the area that is now Marceline became

the springboard for many other small towns, and Marceline became the headquarters for the Santa Fe Railroad's Missouri Division. During the late 1940s and 1950s, Marceline grew from being a railroad and coal mining town to an industrial center mostly known for its printing and publishing industry. Today it is the new home of the Linn County Leader, the area's weekly newspaper, as well as Moore Fans, Walsworth Publishing Company, Hurtt Fabricating Company, and many other large employers. Several churches, parks, a softball field, stores, banks, restaurants, and an art gallery are all part of Marceline, and

visitors will find many of the original buildings still standing. The Carnegie Library in Marceline opened on November 1, 1920, and is still in operation as a library.

Meadville

Meadville is located in southwest Linn County. The population was 415 at the time of the 2020 Census, and a post office has been in operation since 1869. The community was named for Charles Mead, superintendent of the St. Joseph Railroad. Parson Creek flows past one mile to the west. Churches, a bank, an insurance office, several other small businesses, the Linn County R-IV School District, and Strickler Park are located in the central part of town.

Those who are interested in demographics have Irene Barnes Taeuber to thank, as her work is credited with establishing the science of demography and she was born on Christmas Day 1906 in Meadville. Joseph Donald Barnett, a college basketball coach at several Division I institutions including Winona State, High Point, and Hawaii Pacific, was born January 10, 1944, in Meadville.

It is also home to the Locust Creek Covered Bridge, a link in one of the nation's earliest trans-continental roads. The bridge, built out of white pine, used the Howe-truss system named for William Howe who patented the design in 1840.

Purdin

Purdin, located in northwest Linn County, was platted in 1873 and named for its founder, Allen W. Purdin. The population was 141 at the time of the 2020 Census. The post office there has been in operation since 1877. It is where the Linn County R-1 School District is located. Purdin has a cemetery, the Bank of Brookfield-Purdin, two churches, a community center, the Missouri Energy Propane Company and a meat processing business.

Parks & Recreation

There's something for everyone to enjoy in Linn County when it comes to parks and recreational opportunities. Hunters and anglers find ample opportunities to gain that prize catch. Those who play ball will head for the baseball and softball fields. For those who enjoy observing wildlife, there are nearby wildlife reserve areas. Event planners will find a variety of venues to hold their events, fundraisers, weddings and parties. History and genealogy buffs will also enjoy visiting the historical sites, as well as the city and privately maintained cemeteries where early settlers and known predecessors have been laid to rest. Below is a brief description of these properties:

CITY PARKS:

East and West Twin Parks (Brookfield)

When John Wood Brooks established Brookfield, he wanted a park to look like the Boston Commons, and city leaders later decided to divide the land, creating an oval of land between them. Ever since that time, the area became known as the Twin Parks.

The East Twin Park has picnic tables, a gazebo used for many of the community activities, a war memorial area and park bench, and a memorial rose garden. Memorial trees have also been planted in the East Twin Park.

The West Twin Park also has picnic tables and a playground area. In between the two parks on the oval median area is a Civil War memorial statue. Mature trees are found in both parks, which are surrounded by picturesque Victorian homes. Small town charm in this area alone attracts visitors.

The East and West Twin Parks are both located at the intersections of Main Street, John Street, Linn Street and Park Street.

Simpson Park (Brookfield)

This little triangular-shaped park is located at the intersections of East North, East Prairie and Meade Streets and offers a children's merry-go-round.

Joyce Park (Brookfield)

This neighborhood .62-acre park is located in Brookfield's third ward at the intersections of Sanford and South Brunswick streets. It offers two tennis courts, a basketball court, pickleball court, playground equipment, a picnic table and benches.

Farview Park (Brookfield)

On the corner of Thompson and Hunt streets is Farview Park, an open-air park that features an obstacle course and tire swing within the playground area, but also includes covered picnic tables, a shelter house, a fitness trail, and public restrooms. You can reserve the shelter house for \$20 at City Hall, 116 W. Brooks.

Tormey Park (Brookfield)

Named after Rev. Walter Tormey, who willed the land to the city, this small park features an entrance arch and some benches, as well as a view of the Pepsi Cola mural. The park is

located on the east side of South Main Street.

South City Park (Brookfield)

The largest park in Brookfield, with 43.3 acres—South City Park’s main entrance is located on Image Road off Highway 11. This park has several playgrounds, picnic areas, four shelter houses, and horseshoe pits.

For \$20 at City Hall, visitors can reserve any of the four shelter houses. The east shelter house, the largest, is called the Brick Shelter House. The one at the main entrance is the Fireman Shelter House, and the smaller one in the middle of the park is called Orval Bailey’s. The park has a public restroom located on the far east side next to the Brick Shelter House that can be used by campers at the Ida Road campground; the campground has a \$20 fee per night (fee box located at the campground). Electricity is available with a 30 or 50 amp, and fresh water is located at each site. Also on Ida Road is the Brookfield Aquatic Center open to the public starting on Memorial Weekend and open 7 days a week.

Elk Park (Brookfield)

Located on East John Street across from the Graff Field ball park, this enclosed play area offers playground equipment for small children and a picnic table.

Graff Field (Brookfield)

This baseball/softball practice field is located on East Wood, East John, Shelby and Monroe streets. Originally named Hickman Field after Hickman School, it was later named Graff Field after Howard Graff. It’s used for local team practices as well as the youth football league for practice in the fall, and the annual Summer Alumni Softball Game.

Rusk Park (Brookfield)

Located on South Clinton Street, Rusk Park is named after Barbara and J. Monroe Rusk, who donated seven acres of land in 1975. In 1993 the park board purchased an adjoining 6.93 acres, making this park 13.93 acres. This park has three ball fields, equipped with bleachers, dugouts, a concession stand, bathrooms, playground, basketball hoops, shelter house and picnic area.

Ripley Park

Ripley Park, once known as Ripley Square, was named after E.P. Ripley, former president of the Santa Fe Railroad after he donated 10 lots of land to the park in 1898. The bridge was built by Hurtt Fabricating in 2015 and is designed to be reminiscent of the iron fence surrounding the Disneyland train station. Locomotive 5008 pulled many freight trains until it was donated to the nearby Walt Disney Hometown Museum in 2017. Steam engine #2546 was given to the City of Marceline by Santa Fe and placed in Ripley Square on December 20, 1955. The caboose on the south side of the park was given by Santa Fe and placed in the park on August 10, 1987.

The park, located in the heart of downtown Marceline along Main Street USA has an outside stage area and a new concession stand, handicap restrooms, and multipurpose rooms were built in 2023. The park is the site of the annual Fourth of July Carnival.

Walt Disney Park and Swimming Pool

A newly renovated swimming pool, walking trail, playground, and shelter houses for picnics make up the Walt Disney Park and Swimming Pool at the south end of Marceline. In recent years a skate park has been added and a local non-profit Parks Works is completing fundraising to build a pickle ball court in the park. Public restrooms are also located there, and the lake makes a scenic backdrop for Fourth of July fireworks displays.

Marceline's swimming pool is an all-year facility with a "dome" being placed over the pool in winter months which allows for the area's only year-round public swimming pool.

Pershing Park (near Laclede)

The park includes a boardwalk and hiking trail that winds through a wet prairie near a meandering stream with oxbow sloughs and cutoffs, and into a bottomland forest. The park's wetlands attract a variety of birds and waterfowl as well as scores of other wildlife species. Locust Creek and four small lakes give anglers a chance to try their skills, and visitors can camp out overnight at the campground with electric and basic campsites.

The park is located at 29277 Highway 130, Laclede.

Marceline Parks

The largest park in the system, sitting on 70 acres, Rolling Hills is located at 1040 Ashley Road is still under development. The park has one softball field, one large picnic shelter, four smaller single shelters, two playgrounds and a concession building, with plans for an additional shelter and restrooms. The park has a one-mile loop drive used extensively by residents for exercise and it boasts a ½ mile nature trail, with plans for additional trails. Deer and turkey are abundant in the park.



CITY LAKES:

The Brookfield City Lake, as the town's water reservoir, provides an area for fishing, boating, and picnicking; anglers enjoy catching channel catfish, crappie, and large-mouth bass. The Parks and Recreation Department manages two fishing lakes on approximately four

acres. The lakes are directly behind the Boone Village Shopping Center and are open to the public year-round. The larger lake contains catfish, bass, perch, bluegill, and crappie.

From Brookfield, take Highway 11 east 2 miles, then Jetty Road north.

The Marceline Reservoir, located on Highway WW in Marceline, also offers fishing. This 62-acre lake was constructed as a water supply for the city of Marceline.

From Marceline, take Route WW east .50 miles, then take Lunar Drive north approximately .50 mile to the lake entrance.

CITY CEMETERIES:

Brookfield has the Rose Hill Cemetery. Rose Hill Cemetery is owned by the City of Brookfield. The City Council appoints a five-member board to oversee the operations, including the creation of rules and regulations concerning the placement of items on gravesites; types, materials, composition and placement of headstones, grave markers, monuments, tombs, vaults, or mausoleums; the placement and types of urns, containers, ornaments, flowers, shrubs, planters, trees, and other similar items, and any other matters affecting the care, maintenance, and control of the Cemetery.

The Cemetery is open from 8 am to ½ hour after sunset every day. Office hours are from 8 am to 5 pm Monday through Friday, excluding those holidays recognized by the City of Brookfield.

Marceline has several cemeteries—St. Bonaventure Cemetery, Mount Olivet Cemetery, and Elmwood Cemetery, and Roselawn Cemetery.

The City of Marceline bought the Mount Olivet Cemetery from Percy Randolph in 1931 and it has since been maintained by tax levy. As there were other cemeteries adjoining original Mount Olivet, plans were made to purchase these from the owners so that all cemeteries could be one. In 1940 the Williams Addition was added. Rose-lawn Addition was purchased from James McLaughlin in 1956 and in the same year Atkins Addition was purchased from Clyde Atkins and wife. Donations help keep the cemetery maintained.

Pet visitors are allowed, and residents can participate in activities and use complimentary wireless Internet services.

Bristol Manor of Marceline is a residential care community, which means that residents (or neighbors, as they're called at Bristol Manor) don't need skilled nursing care but need extra assistance that family members can't provide. Brookfield Village and Joyce Place offer apartments and housing in Brookfield, and Section 8 and HUD assistance are available, as well as Low Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC).

Healthcare

A concern for many families who choose to move to quieter rural community areas from urban communities is a lack of available healthcare services. Linn County has that concern covered with a hospital and urgent care center in Brookfield, a healthcare center and dental clinic in Marceline, a mental health service office in Brookfield, an eye care center, and several small clinics located throughout the county. The Linn County Ambulance District is also located in Brookfield.

The Linn County Ambulance District provides emergency and non-emergency transport services for patients in Brookfield. Ambulance Services transports patients to hospitals and healthcare facilities, including transfers between medical facilities throughout Missouri. For example, patients taken to Pershing Memorial Hospital may be transferred to hospitals in Columbia or Kansas City for further emergency care and critical care needs.

Pershing Health System (PHS), also known as the General John J. Pershing Memorial Hospital, is affiliated with Boone Hospital Center in Columbia, and located in Brookfield. PHS is a 25-bed critical access hospital that opened for business as a non-profit hospital in 1960. Community Medical Associates was brought into the hospital to provide more convenient access to ancillary departments and outpatient care. To further address the community's need for a larger scope of services, Pershing invested in a 38,000 square foot addition to the outpatient clinic that includes a state-of-the-art Emergency Room and an updated Laboratory and Radiology Department. PHS provides care for all ages and provides the following services—an Emergency Department, Outpatient Surgery, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Respiratory Therapy, and Radiology and Lab Services. Caring doctors and nurse practitioners go the extra mile to provide quality healthcare to patients, and PHS has two doctors and three nurse practitioners.

PHS has collaborative agreement with several physicians who offer specialty services who come to the hospital monthly to see patients locally.

New to Pershing Health System is a state-of-the-art 80-slice CT scanner with advanced technology that renders the clearest images comparable to any hospital in the country, as well as Body Composition scans using the bodyLOGIC Scan equipment. Pershing also offers help for sleep disorders and a Swing Bed program allowing patients from other hospitals to stay in a hospital setting and get the extra time needed to recover before going home. You can also visit a specialist coming to Brookfield through its specialty clinics. Also available is 3D mammography through self-referral using the new 3D Hologic Mammography System in conjunction with Alliance Radiology for speedy results.

The hospital is located at 130 E Lockling St, in Brookfield, and can be reached by calling 660-258-2222.

The Meadville Medical Clinic is a Rural Health Clinic operated by the Pershing Health System. The clinic's providers focus on quality primary care services including primary healthcare for patients of all ages. It offers care for acute and chronic illnesses, wellness visits, and Department of Transportation (DOT) certified physicals. The clinic is located at 101 E Hayward St, in Meadville and can be reached by calling 660-938-4213.

Education

Families and communities in Linn County and north Missouri consider education an important investment in the lives of their children and young people, as they believe that a strong work ethic and commitment to excellence are components of lifelong success.

Linn County has five public school districts, a parochial K-8 school and a vocational school. Students excel in the classroom and in extracurricular activities such as sports, district and state academic contests and fairs, vocational and college-bound curriculum programs, fine and industrial arts and music. School districts have improved their social media presence, and parents and guardians can monitor their students' progress and receive timely communication from the schools. Student-led organizations pay it forward in their communities by hosting donation drives and various community service activities. Linn County also has a postsecondary trade school, Grand River Welding Institute, in Brookfield.

Brookfield R-III and Marceline R-V share a time-honored and now nationally-recognized rivalry—the Bell Game. The two small towns garnered 1,761,259 votes during the USA TODAY High School Sports Rivalry competition in 2012 to become recognized as the Best High School Rivalry in the United States and gathered together in 2013 for a ceremony-filled celebration at a packed stadium event. The Bell Game was first played in 1909 and used a 30-pound brass fire truck bell since 1937 as the iconic trophy for years. Both school districts received \$5000 each in athletic department funding as well as national coverage of the annual game in USA TODAY Sports in 2013 and a specially-designed trophy to be held by the Bell Game winners each year going forward.

The Brookfield R-III School District partners with the Linn County Area Career & Technical Center, as do Linn County R-I (Purdin), Marceline R-V and Bucklin R-II. LCACTC offers the following programs—Computer Networking, Graphic Arts, Welding, Community Education Courses, Early Childhood, Health Sciences and Opportunities Plus. Opportunities Plus works specifically with students at risk of not graduating from high school, and the primary purpose of the staff is to be a liaison between students, parents and the school. Stringent guidelines must be followed, and the program's objectives are academic achievement, time management, study skills and decision-making skills.

Another plus to Linn County is the Grand River Welding Institute in Brookfield, a post-secondary trade school that has an emphasis on stainless steel pipe welding and leads the way in providing coursework that provides in-demand skills in a variety of industrial fields, including food service, manufacturing and construction.

The Brookfield R-III School District has an elementary school, middle school and high school. Sports and academic extracurricular activities enrich and enhance the overall academic experience at Brookfield. The middle school serves 265 students in grades 5-8 and implements Schoolwide Positive Behavior Support (SW-PBS), a framework for creating a safe and orderly learning environment while improving the social-emotional outcomes for students. SW-PBS, utilized by all the schools district-wide, is a proactive approach that relies on developing and teaching clear behavioral expectations, acknowledging appropriate behavior, and using behavioral data to solve problems.

Education

The Bright Beginnings Preschool and Early Childhood Programs at the Brookfield school district offers morning and afternoon sessions which meet Monday through Thursday and closely follows the district school calendar. Prior to enrollment in Bright Beginnings, all children must complete a developmental screening to identify individual needs of each student.

Brookfield athletic teams compete in 23 different sports in the Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA)—football, softball, volleyball, basketball, wrestling, baseball, and track and field, to name a few. A varsity boys cross country team has been added recently.

Sports programs and extracurricular programs in all the area's high schools play an essential role in teaching young people to conduct themselves with honesty and integrity, strive for excellence, persevere through adversity, make sacrifices, and compete with dignity and pride while developing a commitment to teamwork and service to their schools and communities—all important skills that will carry them throughout their lives. And activities such as Future Farmers of America (FFA), the Voice of Democracy essay contests, academic bowls, and Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) prepare students to become leaders outside of the classroom as well as inside the classroom. The fine arts are also well represented at all of Linn County's school districts, and students participate in district contests held at Truman State University in Kirksville. Band, art clubs, choral choirs, and drama clubs allow students to hone their talents and have fun with other students.

Marceline R-V School District has the Early Childhood Center (ELC), Walt Disney Elementary School, and the Marceline Middle School and High School. Marceline's academic clubs include FFA, National Honor Society, FBLA, and students participate in the Voice of Democracy and the Patriots and Pens essay contests sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW). The Marceline R-V School District also offers football, softball, basketball, track, wrestling and baseball.

There are 635 students in pre-kindergarten through 12th grade. According to state test scores, students have an average math proficiency score of 64% (versus the Missouri public school average of 35%), and reading proficiency score of 58% (versus the 45% statewide average).

Bucklin R-II School District has three schools within its district building; the elementary school covers grades pre-K to 6th grade. It participates in the Scholar Bowl, as well as in an athletic program that includes spring and fall baseball, softball, track, and junior high and varsity basketball. Like many rural school districts, Bucklin also participates in FFA.

Linn County R-I (Purdin) has a rich local history which includes the nearby communities of Scottsville and Browning. When the Linn County R-1 District was organized in 1950, three country school buildings were moved to Browning to provide enough space. The school district also purchased two other neighboring buildings to be used for classrooms. From 1918 until 1950, the mascot was the Browning Wildcat. When the Linn County R-1 District was founded in 1950, the school was named Liberty High School and the mascot was the Liberty Eagle. When the Linn County R-1 District was reorganized with Linneus

in 1965, the school was again renamed. This time the name was simply Linn County R-1, and the new mascot, the Mustang, remains the mascot today. The Browning building was the junior and senior high school during this period. The new building, now in Purdin, was first used in 1981-1982 and is located about three miles east of Purdin, a location central to Linneus, Purdin and Browning. The former Browning school has been used as an automobile repair garage and as a bed-and-breakfast visitor site, among other previous uses. Today, the Linn County R-I School District participates in area athletic events—junior high and high school basketball, softball, baseball, and track.

Linn County R-IV (Meadville) also participates in junior high and high school basketball, cross country, and softball and baseball. Like many rural community school districts in Linn County, the challenge remains to keep up with ever-changing local district, state and national standards. Rural school districts recognize that they are preparing students for life beyond the communities in which they grow up, and all school districts in Linn County meet these challenges with persistence, dedication, and compassion. Linn County R-IV participates in the Tri-County Conference, along with Bucklin R-II and Linn County R-I, and includes academic extracurricular activities in art, music (band and chorus), and drama.

Parochial schools include Father McCartan Memorial School and Locust Creek Mennonite School.

The Locust Creek Mennonite School is located in Linneus. It has 14 students in grades 1-8 and has a student-teacher ratio of 7 to 1. Father McCartan Memorial School, next door to the St. Bonaventure Church in Marceline, serves Linn County parishes and provides educational services for preschool through eighth grade. Fr. McCartan School provides students with many opportunities for personal development. These activities include the Bellarmine Speech League, Science Fair, Religion Fair, Music Enrichment Day, National Geography Bee, Sketch Day, Basketball and other sports and numerous classroom extension projects. Students attend mass two mornings a week and are routinely involved in planning liturgies. The student-to-staff ratio averages nine students per grade to each teacher, which allows for individualized instruction. Their junior high students participate in the Patriot and Pen essay competition sponsored by the VFW.
